

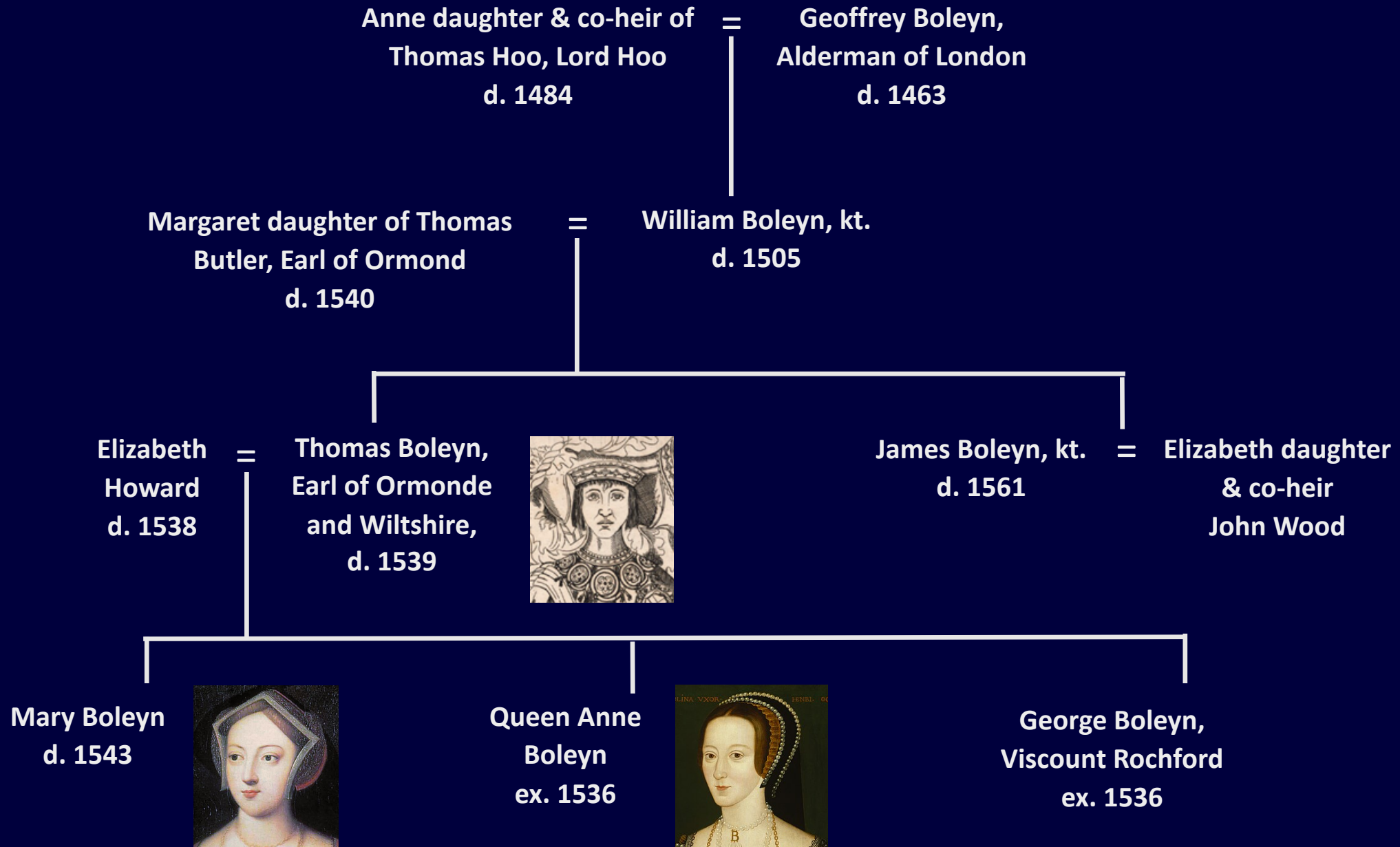

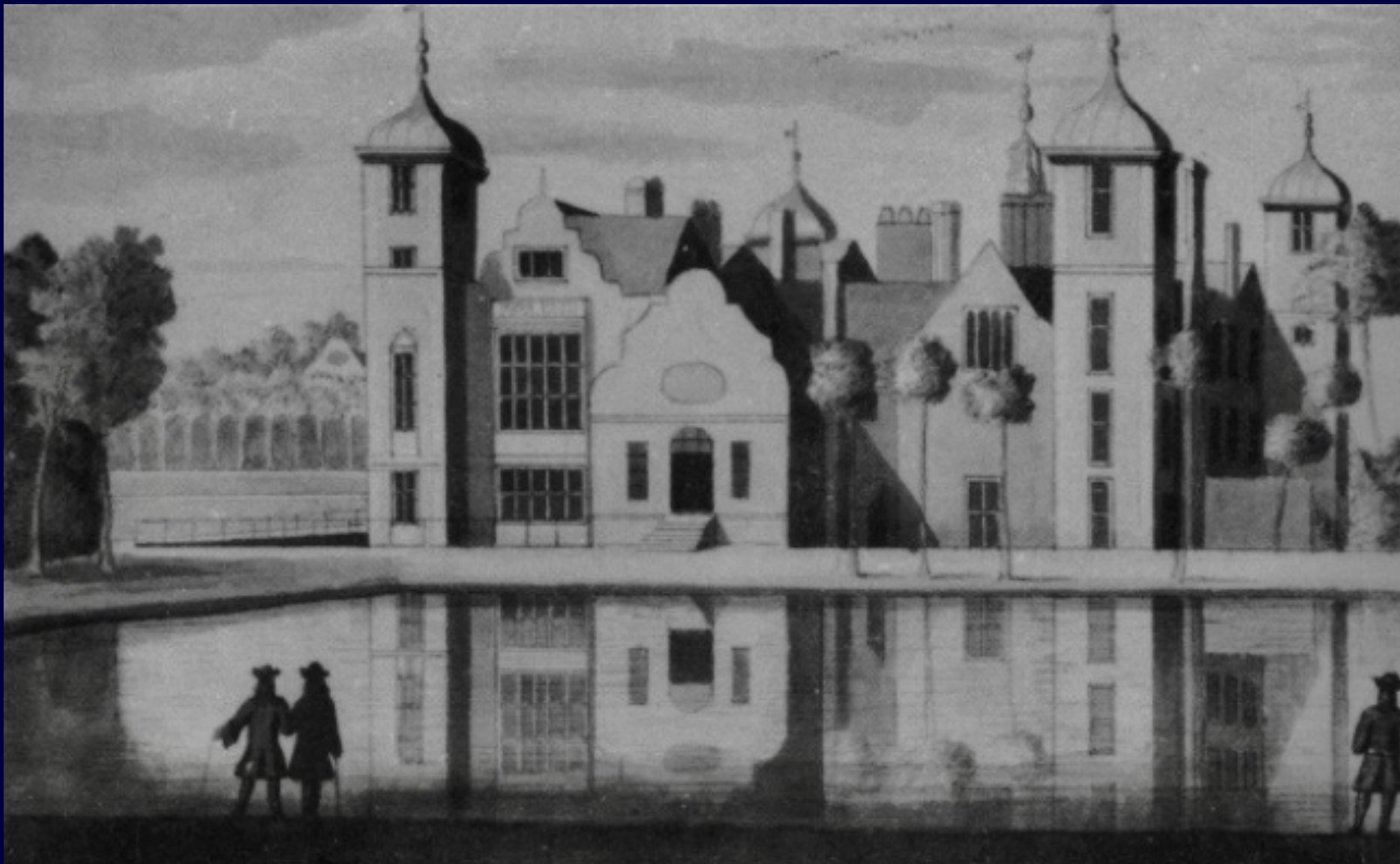
The Boleyn family tree

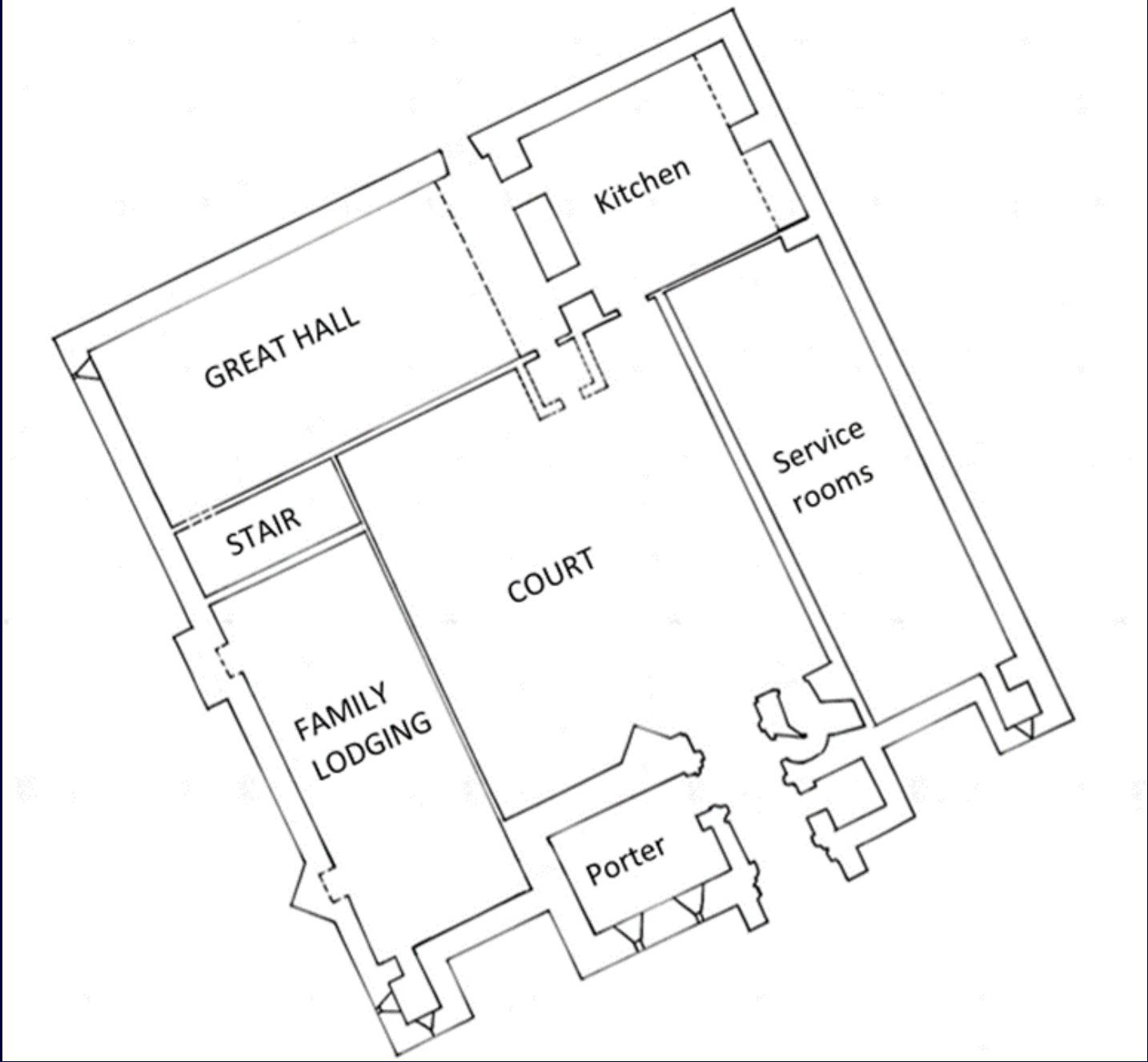

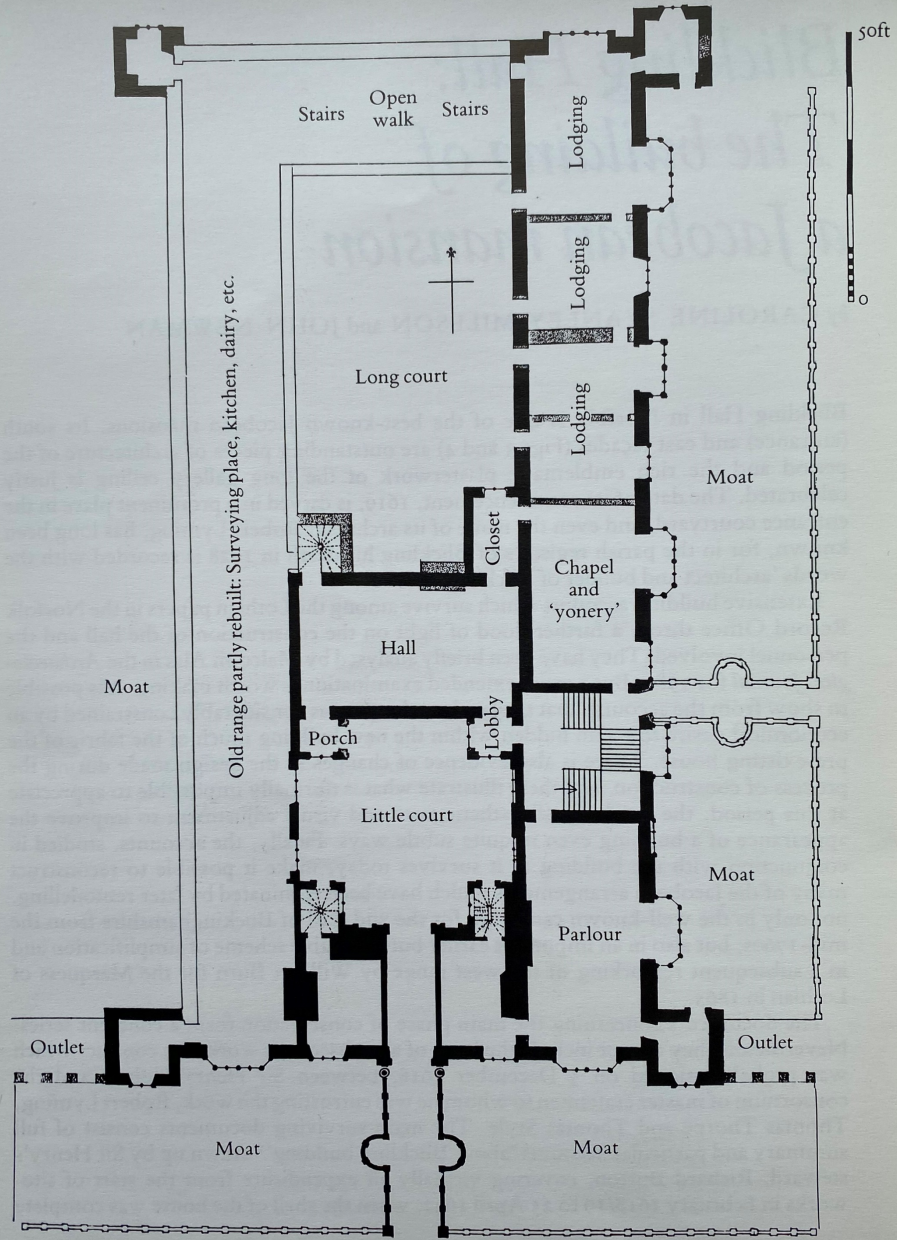




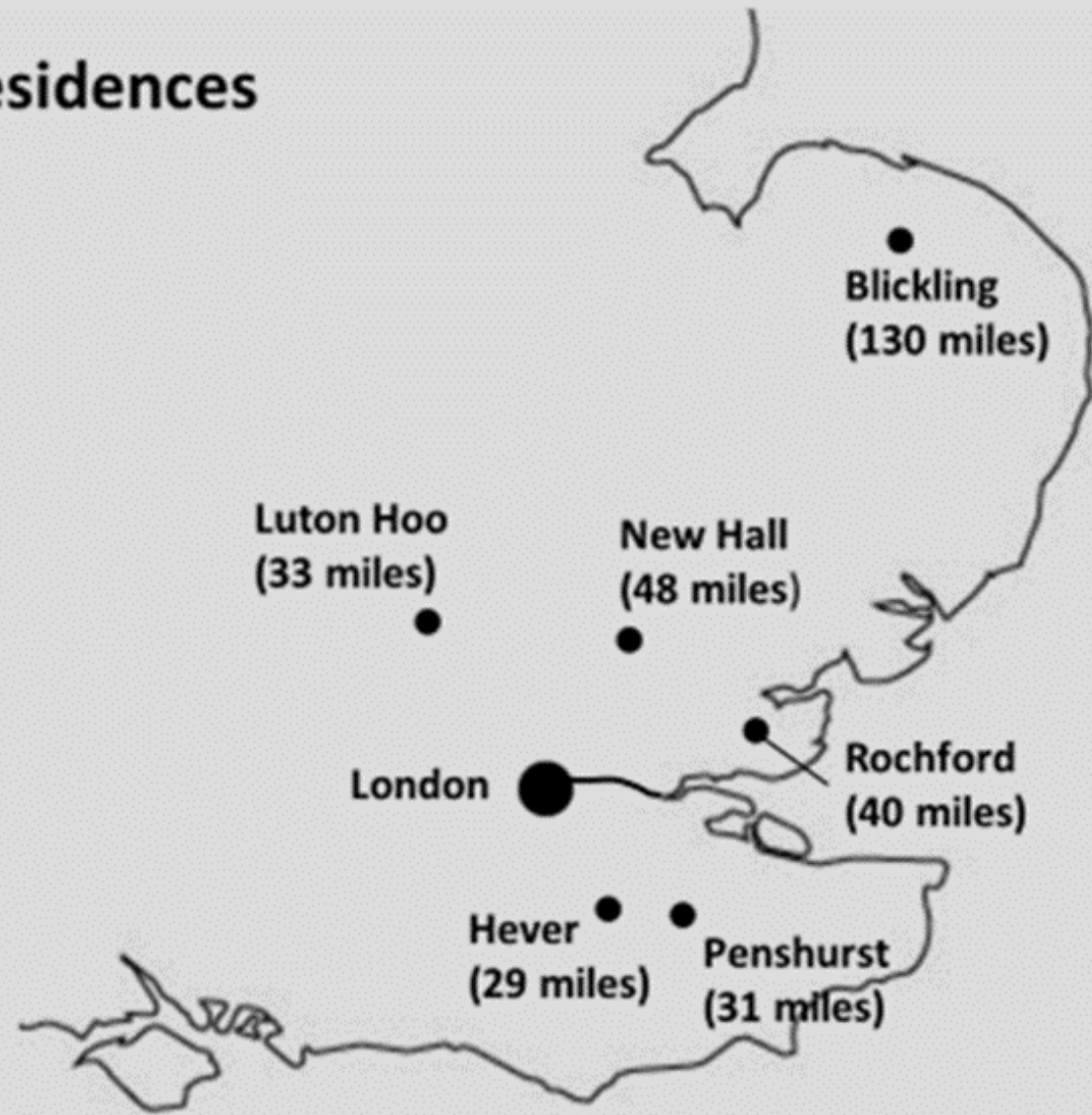

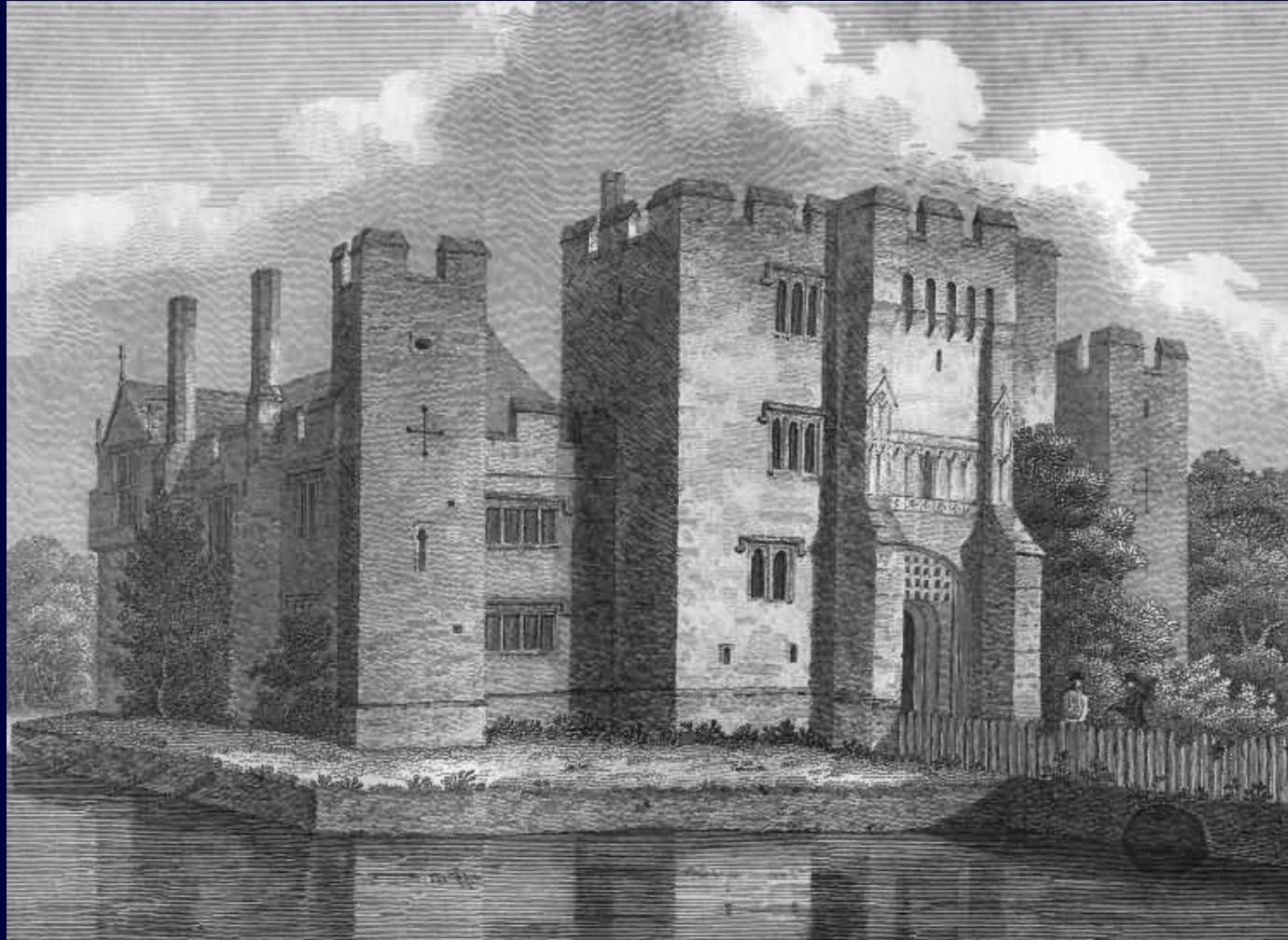

THE WEST VIEW OF HEVER-CASTLE, IN THE COUNTY OF KENT.

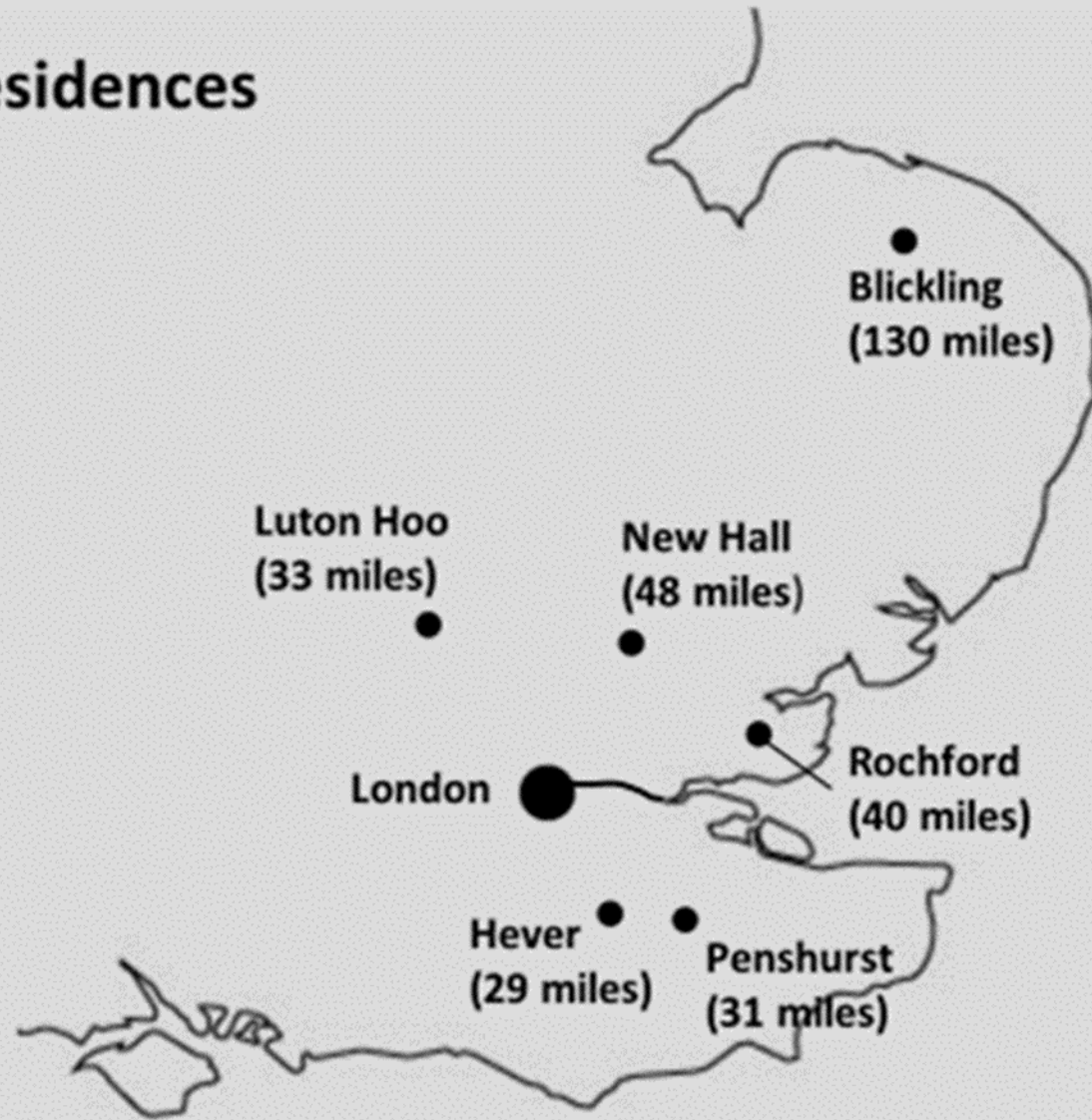

of H. Son of Thomas de Hever being on H. Edm. III. being carry'd this Castle by marriage to Reginald
Cobham of Berborough adjoining of which Family was purchas'd by Geoffry Bullen Grandfather to F. The
Bullen N. of the Garter & Earl of Wiltshire on the Surrender of his Son, George Bullen 1st Lord
& Coheir to the Crown, where it continued till H. James I. granted it to F. Edm. Willgrave Bar^{ts} Esq^r & Coheir
from whom James I. Willgrave convey'd it to F. Will. Humphreys K^t & Bar^t M^{ayor} of London A.D. 1715.
Father of J^r present F. Orlando Humphreys Bar^t whose Son & heir Apparent Rob^t Humphreys Esq^r now enjoys it.

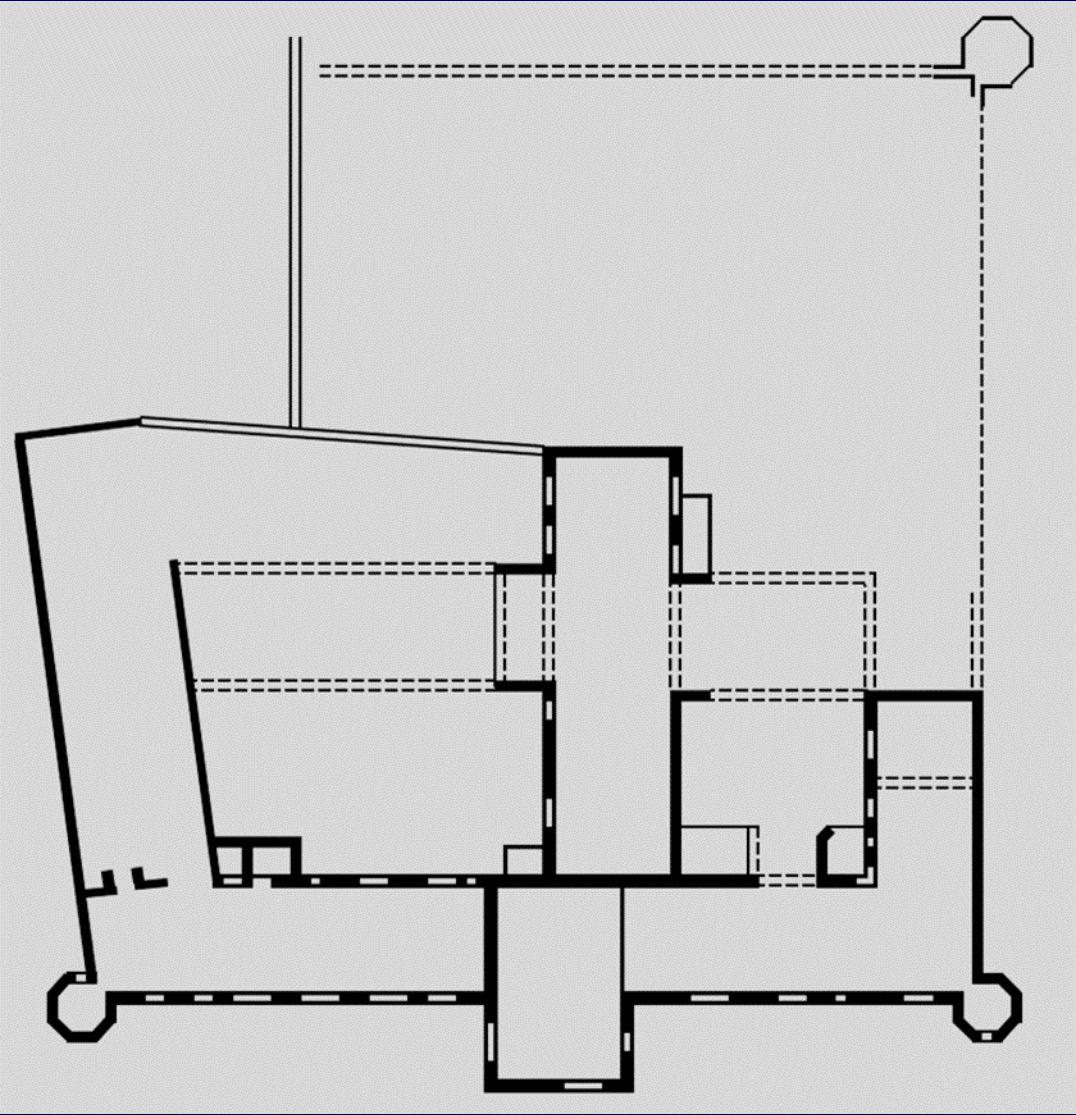

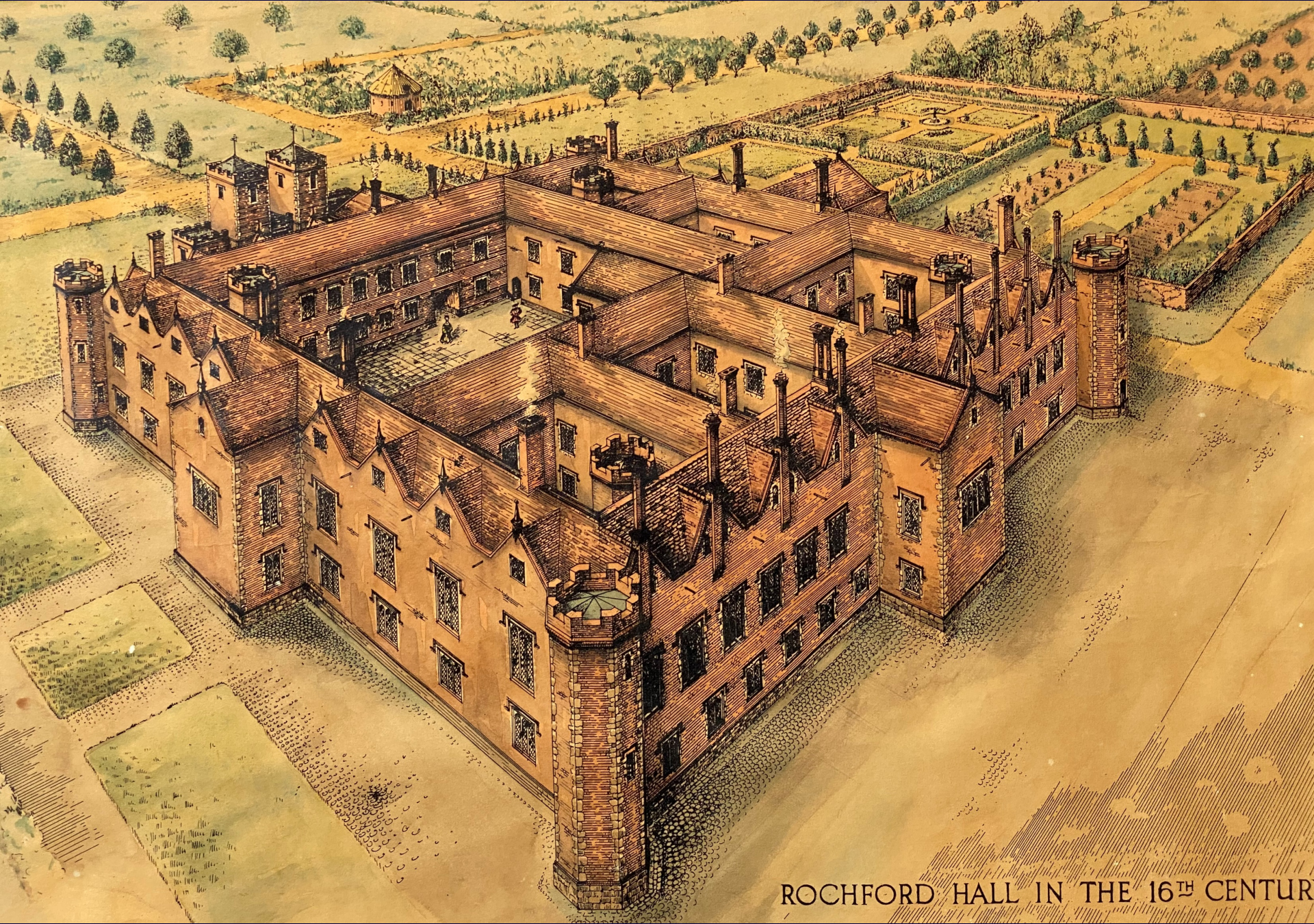
